The Gospel in Ruth

Now these are the generations of Perez: Perez fathered Hezron, Hezron fathered Ram, Ram fathered Amminadab, Amminadab fathered Nahshon, Nahshon fathered Salmon, Salmon fathered Boaz, **Boaz fathered Obed, Obed fathered Jesse, and Jesse fathered David** (Ruth 4:18-22).

The book of the **genealogy of Jesus Christ**, the son of David, the son of Abraham...and Salmon the father of Boaz by Rahab, and **Boaz the father of Obed by Ruth, and Obed the father of Jesse, and Jesse the father of David the king**.... and Jacob the father of Joseph the husband of Mary, of whom Jesus was born, who is called the Christ (Matthew 1:1, 5-6, 16).

The Gospel in Ruth

Dear Saints of ADBC,

As you read the Bible, four distinct plots rise prominently to the surface: Creation, Fall, Redemption & New Creation (also called Consummation). Creation is clearly seen in Genesis 1-2. The Fall comes sharply on the scene in Genesis 3 (and we continue to see its effects throughout the biblical story). We then have to wait until Revelation 21-22 to be introduced to the new heavens and new earth, the consummation of all things. That leaves a lot of pages between Genesis 3 and Revelation 21. And herein, we find the grand narrative of the scriptures: **REDEMPTION**.

While the Bible is comprised of 66 total books, written by dozens of human authors, the Bible is ultimately ONE story written by ONE Author - God Himself (2 Timothy 3:16-17; 2 Peter 1:20-21). Unlike most human authorship, God is not writing this story as He goes. Instead, He has "declared the end from the beginning and from ancient times things not yet done" (Isaiah 46:10). From Genesis to Revelation, the Bible progressively reveals the beautiful, redemptive story of the Gospel. Immediately following man's rebellion at the Fall, God provides this redemptive promise, embedded within the curse pronounced on the serpent (Satan): "I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your offspring and her offspring; he shall bruise your head,



and you shall bruise his heel" (Genesis 3:15). As God's eternal plan of redemption is revealed progressively in the scriptures, it becomes abundantly clear that this promise is ultimately fulfilled in Jesus Christ, the eternal Son of God.

But before this redemptive plan is fully realized in the incarnation, perfect life, sacrificial death, and victorious resurrection of Christ, this redemptive plan runs right through the Book of Ruth. The same God who providentially "declares the end from the beginning" on large, global scales, is also providentially working behind the scenes in a seemingly insignificant Israelite (and Moabite!) family in a seemingly insignificant town of Bethlehem Ephrathah. And in the midst of all the events - big and small - He is providentially working His plan of redemption.

The Book of Ruth is one of the most beautiful love stories of all time. But as we'll see over the coming weeks, Ruth reveals a greater love story and a greater marriage than Ruth and Boaz. There's a greater Offspring than Obed. There's a greater future King than David. And there's a greater Redeemer than Boaz.
